

DEVELOPING CYBER ORGANIZATIONS AND WORKFORCES

This course equips students to gain a comprehensive understanding of military cyber terrain, design effective organizational structures, apply cyber workforce frameworks and develop strategies for recruiting, retaining and managing high-performing cyber defense personnel. Military Articles and Services List (MASL) P179938 is used when this resident course is scheduled in Monterey.

OBJECTIVES

Upon conclusion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Understand components of military cyber terrain to analyze national cyber threats and risks.
- Design military cyber organizational structures aligned with national guidance and mission requirements.
- Create workforce structures to meet national and military cyber defense objectives.
- ♦ Apply Human Resource Management (HRM) concepts to recruit, retain develop and manage cyber personnel.
- Use the Institute for Security Governance (ISG) Cyber Workforce Compendium to navigate career pathways and cyber workforce development.
- ♦ Develop strategies for a resilient workforce capable of providing defensive cyber operations for mission assurance.

TOPICS

Through a combination of lectures, discussion, and hands-on exercises, participants will explore key topics and apply concepts in a scenario developed specifically for this course. Course topics may include:

- Military Cyber Terrain, including Information Technology (IT), operational technology, and platform IT
- Cyber organizational design, including force planning and force development
- Cyber workforce development

- Cyber threats and risks for and understanding the conflict and whole-of-society considerations
- HRM concepts including job design, recruitment, and workforce development
- Cyber for mission assurance to ensure cyber organizations support military mission execution

PARTICIPANTS

This course is designed for mid- to senior-level military officers (O4 to O6) and civilian equivalents from defense organizations including Ministry of Defense (MoD), Armed Forces, and other national security organizations. It is ideal for cyber operators, human capital management specialists, and cyber leaders seeking to develop strategic leadership skills in designing and leading mission assurance oriented cyber organizations and workforces.
