Functional Area Description

The Advise, Train, and Educate (ATE) functional area includes programs and activities that help a partner nation develop more effective defense institutions, ensuring effective oversight, management and execution of logistics, personnel, and resource management, strategy, policy, and doctrine. It also includes programs and activities that support participation of partners in relevant multilateral education and training programs to educate partners on specific topics (e.g., the Regional Centers for Security Studies, the Inter-American Air Forces Academy, and international engagement authorities for Service Academies). Finally, this functional area includes programs and activities that enable the security cooperation workforce (SCW) and U.S. forces to advance security cooperation professionalization and meet training requirements that improve readiness with the benefit of helping partners develop skills and operational concepts in line with U.S. interests.
