Functional Area Description

The SCO functional area is focused on security cooperation (SC) operations conducted by a U.S. Military Group assigned overseas and would typically include members of the armed forces and civilian employees of the DoD working on SC support at U.S. missions. SCO Operations Support professionals play key roles in the execution of SC/DoD implemented security assistance (SA) programs and activities based upon USG priorities and the partner nation's will and abilities.

How will this better prepare you for your work?

SCO Operations Support practitioners working at U.S. embassies will be able to apply their knowledge of the strategic and operational SC/SA environment to competently navigate the complex, dynamic environments within which they are expected to perform their assigned duties, thereby enhancing the overall efficiency and effectiveness of the office. Through SCO functional area certification training and education, the SCO Operations Support practitioner gains facility in their SCO role by working through real-world problems and tasks, applying skills through practical exercises, and elevating their critical thinking skills and communication skills through research and presentations.
